SUMMARY DISPOSITION ORDER (By: Burns, C.J., Lim and Foley, JJ.)

Hubert Kanekoa (Defendant) appeals the August 17, 2004 judgment of the Circuit Court of the First Circuit (circuit court) that convicted him of terroristic threatening in the second degree.

After a meticulous review of the record and the briefs submitted by the parties, and giving careful consideration to the arguments advanced and the issues raised by the parties, we resolve Defendant's points of error on appeal as follows:

There was substantial and therefore sufficient evidence to support Defendant's conviction. State v. Valdivia, 95 Hawai'i 465, 475-76, 24 P.3d 661, 671-72 (2001); State v. Eastman, 81 Hawai'i 131, 135, 913 P.2d 57, 61 (1996); State v. Taliferro, 77 Hawai'i 196, 201, 881 P.2d 1264, 1269 (App. 1994). Accordingly, the circuit court did not err when it denied Defendant's "motion to dismiss" at the close of the prosecution's

case, the prosecution did not fail to prove its case against

Defendant beyond a reasonable doubt, and the circuit court did

not err when it accepted the jury's verdict and entered its

judgment.

2. The circuit court did not err when it refused Defendant's proposed jury instructions no. 6 and no. 7. Valdivia, 95 Hawai'i at 475-76, 24 P.3d at 671-72.

Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the August 17, 2004 judgment of the circuit court is affirmed.
