IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the "appeal" in No. 28089 is dismissed, and Blaisdell may, if he so chooses, file an application for a writ of certiorari in accordance with HRAP Rule 40.1 in Appeal No. 27170. The application must be filed by the close of business on November 28, 2006.
