

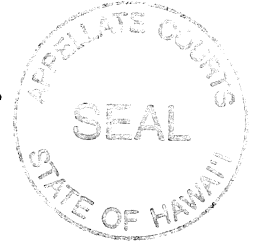
order, any party may apply in writing to the supreme court for a writ of certiorari.").
